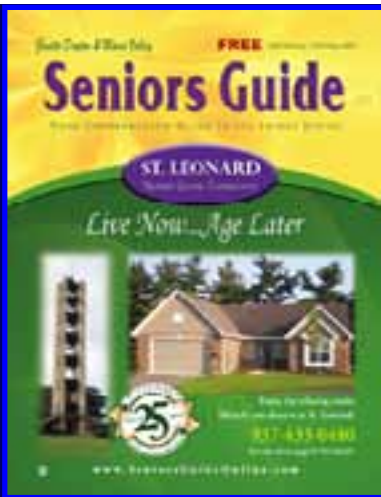

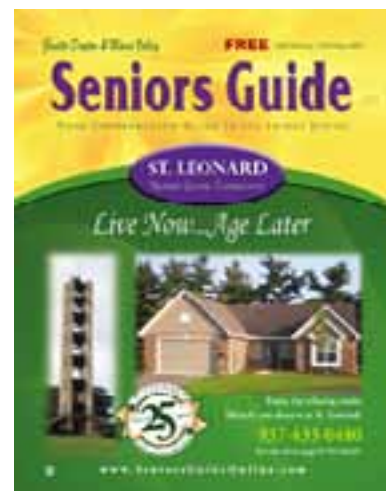
THE ART OF STORYTELLING AT ELMCROFT
